

Stewpot Receives 3,000 Pairs of Socks from Bombas

In January of 2023, the Stewpot received 3,000 pairs of socks from Bombas. A total of 12 boxes each containing 250 pairs of socks. The boxes weighed approximately 30 pounds each. The following number and sizes were received in a mixture of over the calf and ankle socks

Total Pairs: 3,000 (12 Boxes)

500 XL Calf
250 XL Ankle
1500 Large Calf
500 Large Ankle
250 Medium Calf

Even though our clothing room is now closed, Stewpot remains a distribution point for Bombas. Stewpot is at liberty to donate the socks to other nonprofit organizations.

It is a Bombas policy that the socks cannot be sold. The Stewpot will retain some of the socks which will be given to the Stewpot diners during the normal lunch hours once a month. So far, the following number has been donated to the these organizations.

Volunteers are always needed at the Stewpot.

Volunteers typically help prepare sack lunches one day a month, i.e., a certain day of the month and usually work only once a month. There is nothing to preclude working more than once a month. Normal working times each day are from 9:00 am - 11:00 am. Volunteers help make sandwiches and whatever else is being served that day. Something hot, such as soup, stew, or wraps are served once or twice a week. Also, the

items must be placed in paper bags which Jason and Yolanda carry down to the serving area. For special occasions, a hot meal is prepared and served downstairs rather than sack lunches. For these occasions, the regular team prepares the food and a special team serves the food to the diners. The teams have fun and interact with each other as they volunteer at the Stewpot.

Rather than volunteering for a single day or two, consider volunteering a specific day of each month (I,e,. the first Monday of each month, the second Tuesday of each month or the 4th Wednesday of each month, etc.
