



Giving back takes many forms. For this crew, it comes in the shape of wood, screws, friendship, and care.










Meet Our New Board Officers and Board Member for 2026-2027

Dear Little Rock Stewpot Inc,

We are pleased to inform you that your pantry has been awarded \$2000 in food credits on your Arkansas Foodbank Agency Express food ordering account. These credits are available for immediate use.

This generous gift comes from a donor who wanted to support the Foodbank and our partner pantries during this critical time. The amount allocated to your pantry was determined based on the number of individuals you serve. While we wish we could do even more, we've worked hard to provide as much support as possible.

We encourage you to stock up your pantry now. We are seeing a 10–30% increase in first-time visitors, and in some areas, the number of individuals served has doubled due to the ongoing federal shutdown. It's essential that your pantry is prepared to meet this rising demand.

Please stay in touch with us as you navigate any increased needs. We are here to support you however we can.

Thank you for everything you do to make our neighbors feel welcomed and supported during this time.


STEWPOT LOVES SURPRISES






